

## 2017 Utility Rate Notice

Effective with usage beginning January 1, 2017, the water and sewer utility rates have increased as follows:

### Water Rate -



Increased from \$6.08 to **\$6.37** / 1,000 gals

### Sewer Rate -



Increased from \$6.79 to **\$7.03** / 1,000 gals

The increased rates will result in a minimum quarterly utility bill of:

\$120.60 Water & Sewer

+ \$ 1.59 MN Service Connection Fee

+ \$ 6.00 Stormwater Utility Fee

**\$128.19 Total Minimum Quarterly Bill**

(A minimum bill includes up to 9,000 gals of usage)

## Brush Pick-Up Dates

The Brush Pick-Up dates for the next three months will be April 24 - 28, May 22 - 26, and June 26 - 30. Place your brush near your regular refuse pickup site by 7:00 a.m. on Monday of these weeks and our city Public Works employees will remove the brush. They will attempt to complete the pickup during the scheduled week, but the schedule may be pushed back due to their workload or weather conditions.

## Yard Waste Site is Now Open

The yard waste site opened on March 15 and is available at the following times 7 days a week:

Now until May 31:	6:30 AM-8:00 PM
Jun 1 - Jul 31:	6:00 AM-9:00 PM
Aug 1 - Aug 31:	6:00 AM-8:00 PM
Sep 1 - Sep 30:	7:00 AM-8:00 PM
Oct 1 - Oct 31:	8:00 AM-6:00 PM
Nov 1 until Closing:	7:00 AM-5:00 PM

Key cards issued in previous years will need to be renewed at city hall for \$5.00 to gain access to the yard waste site during the current year.

New permits and keycards are available at city hall for the purchase price of \$10.00.

## Special Large Item Pick-up

The next Special Large Item Pick-up is :  
**Saturday, May 6, 2017**  
beginning at 7:00 a.m.

This service is for Waite Park residents ONLY. Apartment tenants, businesses and members who do not receive city-provided refuse service are not entitled to this special pick-up.

### Items Accepted

Electronic equipment  
(including TVs and Computers)

Appliances

(No more than one of each type per property)

Furniture

Carpet

Minimal Demolition Materials

Yard Waste—**only if in compostable bags**

- **Compostable plastic bags showing this logo**



Or

- **Kraft Paper (eco) Bags**



## What is Acceptable Yard Waste?

Acceptable yard waste is considered to only be **grass clippings, leaves and garden waste.**



Tree branches and brush from trees or hedges are **not** considered yard waste for the Large Item Pick-up. You need to place these items out for Brush Pick-up or bring them to the city Yard Waste Site.

### Items Not Accepted

Tires

Any Liquids

(Including: Cooking Oils, Motor Oil, Fuel, Antifreeze, Paints, Stains and Varnish)

Fluorescent Light Bulbs

Car Batteries

Button Batteries or Rechargeable Batteries

Full or Partially Full Aerosol Cans

Construction Materials

Concrete

## Tornado Safety Information

### What To Do During a Tornado Event

#### In a House With a Basement

Avoid windows. Get in the basement and under some kind of sturdy protection (heavy table or work bench), or cover yourself with a mattress or sleeping bag. Know where very heavy objects rest on the floor above (pianos, refrigerators, waterbeds, etc.) and do not go under them. They may fall down through a weakened floor and crush you.



#### In a House With No Basement

Avoid windows. Go to the lowest floor, small center room (like a bathroom or closet), under a stairwell, or in an interior hallway with no windows. Crouch as low as possible to the floor, facing down; and cover your head with your hands. A bath tub may offer a shell of partial protection. Even in an interior room, you should cover yourself with some sort of thick padding (mattress, blankets, etc.), to protect against falling debris in case the roof and ceiling fail.

#### In a Car or Truck

Vehicles are extremely dangerous in a tornado. If the tornado is visible, far away, and the traffic is light, you may be able to drive away from its path by moving at right angles to the tornado. Otherwise, park the car as quickly and safely as possible -- out of the traffic lanes. Get out and seek shelter in a sturdy building. If in the open country, run to low ground away from any cars (which may roll over on you). Lie flat and face-down, protecting the back of your head with your arms. Avoid seeking shelter under bridges, which can accelerate the wind while offering little protection against flying debris.
